Midland Mayhem **All American OLIO**



A late Thursday afternoon mixer with snacks & beverages, followed by an evening with dinner, dancing & a little bit of mayhem, provided by the Midland Community Theatre's Summer Mummers Troupe will kick off the MD2 Convention festivities in Midland. While no one gets to see the world renowned Summer Mummers Melodrama until opening night (usually after Memorial Day), the Lions of Texas will be treated to a dress rehearsal of the equally famous, All-American OLIO, in recognition of the countless hours Lions volunteer in service every year.

Melodrama is a unique theatrical experience, invented in the USA. But nobody does it quite as uniquely as Summer Mummers. A Permian Basin summer tradition for more than fifty-nine years, it is the longest continuing melodrama in the United States and is internationally renowned. They have performed in Ireland and China, proving that laughter is indeed a universal language. The oldest auxiliary organization at Midland Community Theatre, Summer Mummers entertains thousands of patrons each summer with a brand new melodrama each year.

In a recent year, visitors to Summer Mummers represented 8 foreign countries, 34 different states and 136 Texas cities and towns - a remarkable attendance for a remarkable event. Hundreds of out-of-town visitors travel to Midland each year to enjoy shopping, dining out, spending the night and attending Summer Mummers.

Nearly 100 volunteers each night give collectively an amazing 13,400 volunteer hours each summer. Before the first ticket is sold and lights shine on the stage, the Summer Mummers volunteers are hard at work. They not only select the original script; they cast the show, sell advertising, order supplies, organize production committees, clean the theatre, and make costumes; and every volunteer actor and dancer in the Melodrama and Olio has given between 60 and 120 hours of rehearsal time.

All performances conclude with the All-American OLIO! The Olio is a series of short sketches, dances, and audience participation skits. Each sketch is about 60 seconds of mayhem, making the Olio a fast-paced, laugh-a-minute extravaganza. Many of the sketches come from the minds of our volunteers who diligently watch television and scour the internet looking for what is most likely to keep the audience laughing.

So from one group of volunteers to another – come join the

mayhem that is OLIO!





COMMEMORATIVE AIR FORCE



Collecting aircraft for over a half a century, the CAF now ranks as one of the largest air forces in the world. Today the CAF has approximately 9,000 members and a fleet of almost 160 airplanes representing more than 60 different types—including planes from several foreign countries and other military conflicts since World War II. By the end of World War II America had produced over 300,000 aircraft. Just 15 years later almost all were gone.

The museum and one of the main hangers is located in Midland. They have members in every state and 28 foreign countries. Our members have joined together and formed units to foster camaraderie and, in many cases, actively support one or more of the classic military aircraft operated by the CAF.

GEORGE W. BUSH CHILDHOOD HOME



It may be called the George W. Bush Childhood Home, but it was the home of two U.S. Presidents, a governor, and a first lady. After 5 years of research, documentation and restoration, the home was officially dedicated on April 11, 2006 and a tour through the home provides a nostalgic look into the 1950's. The home is now on The National Register of Historic Places and is a Recorded Texas Historical Landmark.

THE PERMIAN BASIN PETROLEUM MUSEUM



For over 35 years, the Petroleum Museum has shared the petroleum and energy story and its impact on our daily lives. The Museum tells the story of petroleum and the rugged lives of men and women who sought a better life. A visit to the Petroleum Museum is an amazing journey through over 230 million years of history. Located in the heart of the Permian Basin, the Petroleum Museum offers over 40,000 square feet of interactive education and entertainment for adventurers of all ages.

The museum also houses the Chaparral Team Indy car collection & museum. Throughout the 1960s—and into the 1970s and the 1980s—Jim Hall and his team at Chaparral Cars designed, built and raced legendary race cars that thrilled fans, amazed the competition and were considered the most innovative cars of their time. Working quietly from their Midland shop, the Chaparral team took race car engineering to new levels of performance.


SUSIE'S SOUTH FORTY CONFECTIONS

Susie Hitchcock-Hall's love of cooking and entertaining led her to start Susie's South Forty Confections, Inc. in 1991. Originally located down a country road behind forty acres of pecan trees south of Midland. Texas, the "new" factory in downtown Midland is five times the size of the original. Visitors can watch confectioners making toffee and other confections. "When we moved there, in 2002, the new space seemed as big as Texas - so we celebrated by making a Texas-sized piece of



candy!" The Texas Pecan Toffee, Susie's original and still best-selling confection, weighed in at 2,940 pounds (with 2,056.000 calories!) with a retail value of \$57,000. It earned us a Guinness™ World Record! The toffee was donated to local soup kitchens and other non-profit organizations.



Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center Screening Training By PDG Carolyn Keskitalo, Executive Director

Thousands of Lions are diligent in their quest to find and collect used eyeglasses to send to Sight First recycling centers, like TLERC in Midland. There's a great sense of satisfaction in getting several boxes packaged and sent satisfaction for a job well done; but that's just it, the job is not done. How many of these Lions have people right in their own home town that could benefit from the used glasses? How many people could be benefited if these Lions knew how to place used eyeglasses on people in foreign countries on a church or Lions mission trip?

Recycling glasses is useless unless there are people capable of helping people find a pair that will allow them to function properly in their daily lives. Years ago TLERC developed a monthly training program to help Lions learn how to do just that. So to try to give more clubs the opportunity to get a team trained, TLERC will offer a training class at the 2016 State Convention to be held in Midland on May 19-21, 2016. (See related Action Project article this page for details.) The program has 4 main objectives to accomplish with each

training session:

- 1. The absolute necessity to understand the ophthalmic prescription for eyeglasses.
- 2. To provide the necessary knowledge and confidence in the use, care, and maintenance of the instruments used to obtain screening information.
- 3. Selection of glasses that have the allowable variation to improve patients' eyesight.
- 4. Proper fitting of the selected glasses on those we serve.

Overview of the Training

- 1. Record Keeping The importance of records. Reports and why they are needed.
- 2. Anatomy & Physiology of the Eye Structure of the eye & how it works.
- 3. <u>Snellen Charts</u> An important part of the screening. 4. <u>Autolensometer</u> – This equipment reads the prescription on
- a pair of glasses. 5. <u>Autorefractor</u> - This machine will determine the refractive status of the eye.
- 6. Focometer A hand held (non-automated) instrument to determine the refractive status of the eye. Very helpful in remote locations
- 7. Selecting Glasses Selecting a pair of glasses using the Quarter Diopter System, which will improve the person's vision. Learn allowable variances, bifocals for reading, proper fitting of the lenses & frames.

Participants will get hands on experience at the Center's monthly screening

All Lions (Knights of Sight) would benefit from the course. Teams/chairpersons, who collect recycled glasses; mission teams; screeners, plus many others will find this course of interest and helpful in the sight programs in their districts or clubs. Convention Action Project TLERC Adult Training/Screening

Usually club vision funds are spent on putting new glasses on children, making it extremely hard to help needy adults. This is one reason why LCI's Sight First Recycling program came into being. While at the convention, clubs interested in starting their own adult vision screening program with recycled glasses, will have the opportunity to go through TLERC's training program with hands on experience at TLERC's monthly adult screening on Saturday morning. The training is designed to show Lions how to use the equipment, set up the stations needed, and to find useable glasses to give to those in need. It is not designed to teach the actual collection, sorting and preparation of useable glasses. However, for those interested, there will be opportunities to learn about the collection & sorting processes, as well, during the Convention.

Clubs are encouraged to send your Vision or Sight Committee Chairman to the 2016 Midland Convention and start making a difference in your community. Make note on your convention registration, so we can register you in the training class. The training is scheduled for Thursday afternoon, Friday morning & afternoon, and Saturday morning.

With this training clubs should be able to set up their own screening programs locally or put together Lion or church mission trips abroad to those areas in need of eyeglasses.

Texas Ramp Project

A Modern Day Barn **Raising Effort** By John Laine **Executive Director**


The Texas Ramp Project is a 501.c.3 non-profit organization with a vision that no resident of Texas should lack safe access to their home for financial reasons. Incorporated in 2006, the TRP grew out of an earlier project called the Dallas Ramp Project which served only Dallas and Collin counties. Since the first 40 ramps were built in 2006, the productivity of the TRP has grown each year to 1535 ramps installed in 2014! The ramps are ADA compliant and the client is never charged for the ramp. All referrals come from third party health care providers. Initially the TRP covered areas around Austin, Fort Worth, San Antonio, Amarillo, El Paso and the counties surrounding Dallas and Tarrant counties. Now the TRP stretches from Texarkana to El Paso and Amarillo to Houston with new regions in San Angelo, Waco and soon in Beaumont. The

places and we always need more volunteers. The director of the TRP, John Laine, will be joining the Lions of Texas in 2016 to talk about the project and to solicit more Lions Clubs to come out and build a ramp in their hometown to see if it might fit in with the work of their club. At the convention there will be a seminar to introduce you to TRP and how we assist the volunteer groups with ramp templates, verified referrals, etc. In addition we will actually build a ramp in Midland, as one of the Texas Lions State Convention ACTION Projects, through the Midland Downtown Lions, which has been one of our volunteer groups for several years. Convention Action Project Ramp Construction

A sight will already have been selected and a sight evaluation done, thus the group will pre-build the ramp at the Midland Downtown Lions Center on Friday, and assemble it at a residence on Saturday

Clubs are encouraged to send your Community Service Project Chairman (or other members interested in building type service projects) to the 2016 Midland Convention and start making a difference in your community. Make note on your convention registration, so we can register you in the training seminar. The program is scheduled for Thursday afternoon, Friday and Saturday morning.

With this training and the help of The Texas Ramp Project, clubs should easily be able to set up their own ramp projects in their home town.

Lions Kidsight USA 25 Million Kids Need You, So Get Involved Today!

Last year Lions of the USA kicked off **Lions KidSight USA**, a nationwide program to safeguard the vision of children aged 6 months through 6 years.

According to educational experts, 80% of learning is visual. So if a child can't see well, he/she can't learn well. Yet most young children don't get their vision screened until they have problems learning or paying attention in school. By then, it may already be too late. Unless vision problems are detected early and corrected, they risk becoming permanent by age 7. Lions in the USA already screen more than 500,000 kids per year through state-wide and local programs often known as "KidSight." About 7-15% of kids screened will be referred for a follow-up exam by an eye-care professional.

The **Lions KidSight USA** mission is to ensure eye screening and follow-up care is given to all kids because every child deserves to learn and see the world clearly.

Change a Life by Becoming a Vision Screener

With just minutes of training, any Lion or volunteer can screen the vision of a child. Just push a few buttons and the screening devices used in KidSight do all the work for you. Screening devices even generate the results immediately for easy management of screening results. It's simple, it's fun, and there's nothing more rewarding then helping a child!

The Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is supporting the development of the program by considering matching grants for districts where at least two more clubs are financially involved, per the regular grant criteria. Districts or MDs can apply for matching Standard Grants in amounts between US\$10,000 and US\$100,000 to purchase or replace/upgrade devices and put in place other program infrastructures. LCIF has already awarded US\$2,199,990 in grants since fiscal year 2000-2001 to help districts and MDs in the USA start children's eye screening programs.

Two equipment manufactures of the screening devices – **Plusoptix** and **Welch Allyn** – are proud Project Partners, and both are providing generous financial support for the development of this national program.

Texas Screening Requirements

In the fall of 2014, Texas school children eye screening requirements changed to include the use of device based screening. Prior to the change, only 2 devices were approved. If a refer result was obtained, there needed to be a second screening done using an approved chart. The new requirements state that devices "may be used for individuals through five years of age and those with disabilities who do not respond well to other allowable screening methods. If automated screening device is used, pass/fail documentation of results should be recorded."

The second screening need not be done and the "pass" or "refer" result should be noted on the screening

form.

The person screening "must have successfully completed instrument specific training (including passing all associated tests) in accordance with manufacturer guidelines and must have a full understanding of the pass/fail referral criteria in accordance with AAPOS standards". The device manufacturers approved by the Lions KidSight USA board provide certified training courses


as required by the state.

Convention Action Project Children's Vision Screening

While at the convention Lions desiring to start their own children's vision screening program will have the opportunity to train on the equipment, become certified in the use of the equipment, and then do an actual screening of children at a daycare to gain the experience needed to go home and start your own program.

Clubs are encouraged to bring your Sight Committee Chairman (or other Lions interested in children's sight programs) to the 2016 Midland Convention and start making a difference in your community. Make note on your convention registration, so we can register you in the training class. The training is scheduled for Thursday afternoon and the field work on Friday.

Due to recently relaxed portions of Texas law (see Texas Screening Requirements this page), vision screening equipment such as the SpOt and PlusOptix can now be used to screen some school children, if the screener is certified. If you already have a screening program and don't need training, but do need certification, certification only seminars will be provided by both companies on Saturday afternoon.

Camp & Diabetic Programs to be Featured


Many parents are aware of the Texas Lions Camp (TLC) and many have been approached about sending their children to camp; but not having been there and not knowing much about the camp (or about Lions for that matter) they are afraid to let them go. On Saturday at the convention TLC will host a seminar for parents, school nurses, and Lions, who want to know more about sending handicapped, diabetic and Downs Syndrome children to the "Gem of Texas Lionism", the Texas Lions Camp.

The second seminar, also on Saturday, will be directed towards the grandparents and caregivers/babysitters of Type I diabetic children. RN instructors from Dr. Stephen Ponder's diabetic training team will give basic information on what to do when Type I diabetes hits your family. Dr. Ponder is the Medical Director of TLC's Diabetic Camp and one of the foremost endocrinologists in the state working with pediatric diabetes. His team routinely gives such seminars to educate families about Type I diabetes. Lions faced with this dreadful disease in their family will also want to attend the seminar. Providing public service seminars such as these can help improve the lives of many children and their families, while the public exposure can help our Lions clubs grow, expanding our service possibilities to improve even more lives.

printmaking artist who carves woodblocks and linoleum to make limited-edition, fine art, hand-pulled prints. It is the traditional Western-style of relief printmaking using oilbased inks on archival 100% cotton rag paper. His award-winning work has been shown in several exhibitions in the Dallas metroplex and North Texas area. And, it is found in private collections around the United States. "I make art from a home-made press," he states. "I built it from lumber and steel angle iron around a 6-ton hydraulic hand jack like the kind you use to change a tire on your car. It forms a flatbed press like that used by Gutenberg. (Of course he had to use more muscle because he didn't have the car jack.) I use this press to create traditional woodblock and linocut limitededition relief prints in

a realistic style. My

black-and-white prints



resemble fine pen-andink drawings.' Mr. Mann is currently working on a special "Lion" linocut, which will be premiered at the MD2 State Convention in Midland, where some of his other award winning prints will also be displayed. So, I accepted the two dates . . . one in Tacoma, one in Tucson, but I had no idea what I was going to talk about. I figured I'd better start doing some research! I asked both of those dear people and a few others who were helping set up the conferences, "why did you become a Lion?" The responses I got were mind-blowing. I spent time on their International website . . . incredible.

I began to learn who Lions are, and what Lions are all about. And they are quite wonderful. And they are WOMEN, and men . . . old and young and in between . . . and they are everywhere in this world ... I mean ... everywhere!

I finally go down to the camp and tell my boyfriend at the time, and my husband now, these people are the real heroes. Let's do a documentary on these kids. So that's what we did. We shifted all of our attention away from the more marketable film and spent two years going to the homes and really getting to know the children. The whole experience is the right kind of storytelling."

Mollie Milligan is a Dallas, Texas based actress and business woman. She has a Double Major in Acting and Environmental Science from Baylor

University, as well as an MFA in Acting from SMU. She has done Regional Theatre including Kentucky and Taos Shakespeare. After living in Los Angeles for a few years, she now resides in Dallas with her husband & daughter. She is co-owner of Boxcar Creative. An avid runner, Mollie ran daily up until the day before she gave birth.
